It is especially appreciated that Eddy's uses a dedicated fryer just for French fries, making them one of the few foods that could be safely enjoyed.

Even before that diagnosis, Eddy's food was loved. Eddy's has a gift for experimenting with flavors and creating meals that are far more inspired than the standard Northwoods fare. Loyal customers, including those who eat there weekly, continue to be impressed by the consistency, quality, and creativity that Eddy brings to the menu.

The team's dedication to quality, service, and community impact makes them more than just a restaurant—they are a cornerstone of the town and truly worthy of this recognition.

Mediquest Insurance Services, Inc. - Hayward

The Hayward office opened in May 2023 in its current and remodeled location. Mediqwest has been a Hayward Area Chamber of Commerce member since September 2023. Margaret Winter, a Hayward resident, is the agent primarily responsible for serving the Hayward Area and surrounding communities. Margaret joined Mediqwest in November 2022 and has over 25 years of financial services experience. She is a licensed and credentialed health and life insurance agent, also holding the designation of RSSA, Registered Social Security Analyst. Margaret is a prior hayward Area Chamber of Commerce board member.

Mediquest currently stands out as a local, independent health insurance agency, specializing in Medicare and health insurance for individuals under 65. The median age in Sawyer County, WI is 52.2, as per 2019-2023 ACS 5-Year Estimates. In Sawyer County, the population age 60 and older makes up approximately 29.9% of the total population. This is based on the sum of the percentages listed below: 60-69 years old: 13%, 70-79 years old: 5%, 80+ years old: 11.9%

Individuals over 60 need health insurance to cover potential rising healthcare costs, manage chronic conditions, and protect against unexpected medical expenses, ensuring financial stability and access to necessary care. Key options include Medicare (for age 65+), Medicaid (for low-income individuals, potentially combing with Medicare), the Affordable Care Act (ACA) Marketplace (for those under 65 not eligible for Medicare), COBRA (for recent job losers), employer-sponsored insurance, or private options like Medicare Supplement plans (Medigap) or Medicare Advantage plans. The best option depends on age, income, and health needs.

Mediquest agents provide value for the population age 60 and older by offering no cost advice, expertise and enrollment assistance for all key options available to them. Clients can meet with local, independent agents at locations in the communities served.

Mediquest is the only agency of its kind in the Hayward area and surrounding communities. They offer personalized advice by licensed individuals seeking health insurance, regardless of their demographic. Mediquest supports community events, such as the Hayward Veterans Picnic, the Hayward Lions Golf Outing, and the Northland Area Builders golf outing. Margaret Winter is a local independent agent focusing on the specific needs of community members in Hayward and surrounding communities. She provides dedicated office hours to the Hayward community on a regular basis. Given that there is such a great need of assistance in this area, Mediquest opened a brick and mortar office only 7 months after welcoming Margaret to the agency.

Mediquest offers educational sessions through collaboration with the Sawyer County Senior Resource Center and the Sherman and Ruth Weiss Community Library. Other sessions will be offered through the Hayward Community Ed Program in coming months. All sessions are purely educational and offered at no charge.

Mediquest does not conduct business in the same way that national firms do. They do not make telemarketing phone calls or have a call center. Mediquest is a local, independent agency that offers their guidance face-to-face in their local office or in-home for those that cannot travel.

We wish to praise the Mediquest agency and Margaret Winter in particular, for the incredible service they offer to the Hayward community. Specifically, we are talking about necessary but incomprehensible applications and forms required by the government and health care providers. In our case, Margaret quickly cut through a bewildering tangle of Medicare and health insurance forms including deadlines we weren't even aware of. To the average senior these tasks are very difficult and they were handled quickly and professionally.

Also we recommended Mediquest and Margaret to a family member who was struggling with navigating social security disability for his partner. The piles of paper and forms was daunting to say the least, but everything had a positive outcome. In our opinion Mediquest offers a rare and high-quality service to Hayward at no cost, that would be hard to find in a large city.

Medicare is so confusing to understand. You need to understand advantage plans vs supplements. What abt drug coverage? While I worked at Home Medical so many seniors came up and did not understand their Medicare insurance. What does it cover, what not, paid for this drug last year not this year. They sit down with you every year and look at what drugs you are using and may switch your supplement and/or drug coverage. They are so vital to our seniors.

New Moon Ski and Bike

New Moon Ski and Bike was founded in 1976 by Steve & Melisa Morales as a small, seasonal Nordic ski shop. Over time, with the growth of interest in both Nordic skiing and mountain biking, they expanded into a year-round retail destination. Despite the challenges of two consecutive winters with little snow, New Moon Ski & Bike remains a strong and active presence in the Hayward community. The shop continues to foster outdoor engagement by hosting weekly Tuesday night bike rides and, in partnership with the American Birkebeiner Ski Foundation, offering the Trail to Prince Haakon program to support and inspire new skiers. New Moon's commitment to the region extends beyond its storefront. The business has been a dedicated partner in projects like the Mt. Telemark Village Outdoor Center, which provides valuable amenities for both skiers and cyclists. In addition, New Moon regularly hosts and sponsors events that enrich the area's outdoor culture, including the popular "Tour by Day, Race by Night" event on the Birkie Trail system. Through these efforts, New Moon continues to play a vital role in strengthening and celebrating the Northwoods' vibrant outdoor sports community.

R&M Dock and Lift

R&M Dock and Lift is a family-owned business in Clam Lake, providing dock and lift sales, installations, and removals. Rich and Makala built the business from the ground up, including a custom barge and trailer.
